THE FIRST SUNDAY OF THE GREAT FAST

By nature You are beyond measure, O Lord; yet in these last times You deigned to accept the limitations of the flesh. By your incarnation You assumed all aspects of our human nature. We now inscribe the image of your likeness so that we might worthily venerate it, and that we might be raised up to your love from which we drew your great mercy, according to the tradition of your holy Apostles.

Today is the first Sunday of the Great Fast, The Sunday of Holy Images. It is a time for the Divine Liturgy to begin. I rise as the liturgy begins and bow to venerate the Holy Icons of Christ the Teacher and the Holy Theotokos as the priest incenses them. I ponder; Christ is central to these icons. Next, I bow my head as, I too, am incensed as a holy image. But, am I really worthy to receive this honor?

You, O God, have created me to your image but what have I done and what am I doing to become your likeness? Is Christ central to my life? Is Christ evident in both my public and private lives, my thoughts, my words, my actions?

As I gaze upon the holy Image of Christ the Teacher, its spirituality, its holiness, the radiance of peace and love captivate me. Whenever I come before this Icon, Christ is always blessing me. My heart can be filled with joy, my shoulders heavy with burdens, my eyes filled with tears, my soul burning with love...at all times Jesus is loving and blessing me.

What do others see when they look at me, when they really come to know me? Do they see an image of God, a likeness of Christ always ready and willing to be open to others? Do I rejoice with them, share their burdens, wipe their tears and be of service, through my love

To write an icon, an iconographer prepares mentally and spiritually through prayer and fasting to transform an earthly canvas into a heavenly image.

During this Great Fast, through prayer, fasting, spiritual reading, reflection and good works, I, too, can transform my earthly canvas into a heavenly image...reflecting Christ as central in my life, worthy to be incensed.

As God sent His Son to become man, accepting the limitations of the flesh and assuming all aspects of our human nature, so, too, God invites all mankind to prevail over those limitations of the flesh and human nature and to become Godlike.

Create in my a new heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. From temptation, sin and evil, spare me, O Lord, and raise me up to your love from which we draw your great mercy.

LENT....FASTING AND FEASTING

Tradition teaches us to fast during Lent, but because we are being prepared for Pascha, the victory of life over death, we need also to FEAST on the Life God offers as we seek to deepen His life within us. It is appropriate then to FAST & FEAST.

Consider this: FAST from harsh or mean words. FEAST on patience. FAST from worry. FEAST on God's love and care. FAST from sadness and depression. FEAST on joy and peace of mind. FAST from complaining. FEAST on appreciation and gratitude. FAST from bitterness. FEAST on forgiveness. FAST from resentment. FEAST on acceptance. FAST from jealousy. FEAST on being yourself. FAST from self-centeredness. FEAST on compassion for others. FAST from excess. FEAST on moderation. FAST from apathy. FEAST on caring. FAST from discouragement. FEAST on hope. FAST from judging others. FEAST on finding Christ in them.
