GOD'S LOVE FOR YOU

You had no love for God, yet He has exercised unspeakable love to you.

You refused to hear when God called, yet God heard you when you called.

You have rejected Christ and set him at nought, and yet He has become your Savior.

HARMONY OF FAITH
